This “Album” is designed to make the financial needs of L’Arche in the global south more visible and to inspire increased financial support from all people who are committed to the well-being of L’Arche in far-away places.

The L’Arche communities we are supporting receive virtually no assistance from their governments; they work very hard to pay for basic necessities such as food, clothes and medicine. It is essential for all members of L’Arche, individuals, communities and countries, as well as friends of L’Arche, to continue their financial support for the L’Arche International Financial Aid Fund (Solidarity). And given the fact that a number of communities are today underfunded, there is an urgency to increase our support.

One of the most important international responsibilities is to ensure that L’Arche sisters and brothers in financially resource poor parts of the world have the resources they need to live their mission as l’Arche communities.

On behalf of the Federation, L’Arche International supports its members in financially poor parts of the world in two ways:

- 1. Direct funding** through the Financial Aid Program to support operating budgets and capital investments, either for maintenance or development.
- 2. Capacity building;** this includes salaries and related expenses for international envoys and various supports in the areas of spirituality, communication, administration and finances, human resources, development, solidarity, and fundraising.

In 2015 the Federation invested **1.18 M** Euros in **28** L'Arche communities through direct financial aid.

The International Financial Aid Fund is not an endowment. Every year L'Arche must raise the funds needed to support people, homes and programs in the global south.

The total cumulated budget of the 28 communities, located in 20 countries, is 2.577M. The average annual budget for each of these communities is **92K!**

These communities raise from 5 to 60% of their income locally. The balance comes from international sources, including L'Arche's International Financial Aid Program.

Our target for 2016 is **1.135 M**. This amount will not only allow communities to exist, it will also help communities to increase their capacity to grow and develop.

We know that there is huge economic "gap" in our world today. Supporting L'Arche in the global south, by giving to the Financial Aid Fund, is a concrete way of reducing that gap. The impact of this financial support is powerful; there are homes and programs for people with intellectual disabilities in 20 countries where L'Arche would not otherwise exist. This happens because of a firm, constant and irreversible commitment of many L'Arche members and friends.

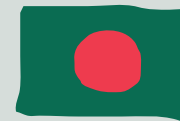

- > In the occupational workshop the core members work on developing skills such as washing dishes, and they also make earrings, necklaces and pen holders.



Gifts of L'Arche Nongr-Maasem

- > The community helps local families to take care of their children with disabilities.
- > Open clinic for the local community once per week.
- > Warmth of hospitality.
- > One core member participated in the Athens Special Olympics in 2011 (and won a gold medal!).

Gifts of L'Arche Croatia

- > Open doors: once per month the community hosts meetings with neighbours, local community members, experts and artists, bringing together parents to meet, grow in trust and discover the value of each person.
- > Outreach and awareness: very involved in the community, through the mobile team that provides support to people in their home and through cooperation with local leaders. As a result there is increased visibility of people with severe disabilities, where they would otherwise be overlooked.



Context and Challenges

- > Economy: The economic situation is difficult and it is challenging to obtain any funding from the government or to make plans for sustainable development in the future.
- > Distrust: the multiple divisions within Croatian society make partnerships difficult. This leads to significantly reduced opportunities for people with disabilities.

- > Many members would not be in security or alive today were it not for L'Arche. L'Arche is a safe place and a real family for them.
- > Spiritually vibrant: the prayer dimension is deep and important in L'Arche Haïti, and attracts many friends.
- > L'Arche is well known in Haïti, and it is seen as a source of human and spiritual values, and a place of hope, giving it a broad impact on culture and society.



Context and Challenges

- > Environmental: Carrefour is located on a major fault line, and has been rebuilt since the earthquake, which destroyed it. The community needs to move into a less-threatening environment.
- > Isolation: Chantal is very far away and is very isolated.
- > Leadership and economic development: Develop leaders that can take the community into the future, and generate more local income.

Context and Challenges

- > Poverty - Forty-six percent of the population of Honduras lives in extreme poverty.
- > Insecurity - Tegucigalpa community recently had to move one of the homes, due to security issues. There is an extremely high violence rate in the country.
- > Resources - Core members are aging and programs to address their specific needs do not exist in the country.

- > Way of life: the daily rhythm of home and workshop provides each member with tasks and responsibilities where each can learn to use their capacities to the full, and creatively share the gift of life.
- > Spirituality: life in community is like a SADANA, a spiritual journey; prayer integrated fully and seamlessly into daily life of community, morning and evening; inter-faith reality on a day to day level (Hindus, Muslims, Christians).
- > Assistants visit family homes of children with intellectual disabilities, who do not live in the community, offering technical input, friendship and support.

Gifts of L'Arche Lithuania

- > Friendship – L'Arche breaks down barriers of communication with members who come from state institutions. It has connections with struggling youth in the area.
- > Impact on Society – The dignity, respect and hospitality shown towards every human being are important examples for the country's social system.
- > Faith – The spiritual life witnesses to a grounded and inclusive community for the larger society, important examples for the country's social system.



Context and Challenges

- > Rigidity – The social care models are still based on Soviet-era norms. Many people with intellectual disabilities still live in large care institutions.
- > Injustice – Municipalities do not equally evaluate the NGOs in the field of social services system and can restrict resources needed for daily community life.
- > Attracting Assistants – It is difficult to attract and keep assistants because of limited financial resources.

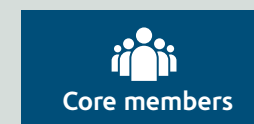

- > Developing – Queretaro welcomed 6 additional core members.
- > Celebration – they are a example of the ability to enjoy and share moments of celebration at any given time.
- > Hospitality – the communities are always grateful to have visitors and to share their homes and meals.



Context and Challenges

- > Funding – needs are great in the wider communities where the L'Arche communities are located, so there are many organizations in need of funding.
- > Attracting long-term assistants – Current conditions in the country make attracting and retaining assistants difficult. This means that we are not able to have more than one home in each community.

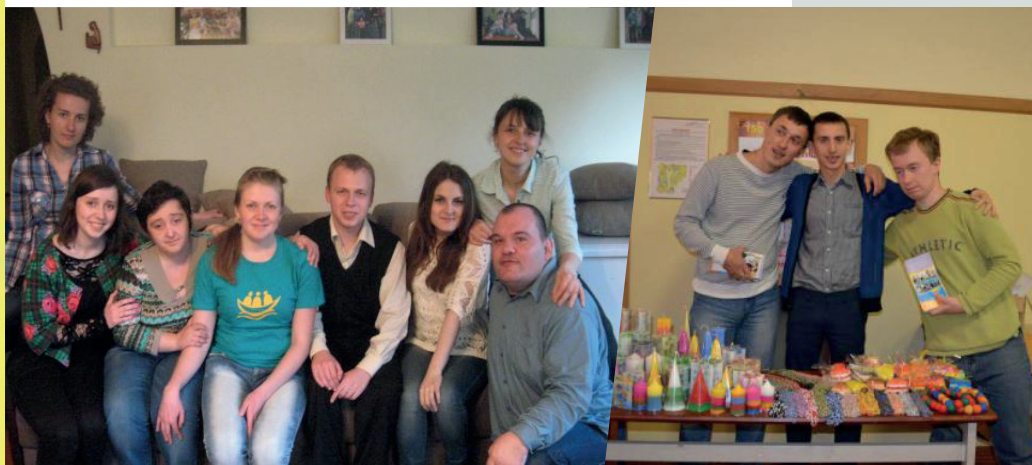

Work Activities

- > Making candles, soaps, wood articles, and hand-made beaded necklaces. Members also work on greeting cards and prints of icons.
- > Learning social and personal care skills, such as cooking, outings, praying and celebrating.



Gifts of L'Arche Kovcheh

- > Respite support – if a need occurs in a family, core members are welcomed to the community house.
- > Witness to the society – 5 workshops are integrated into neighbourhoods around the city. Workers often walk to the sites, and the local communities get to know people with disabilities, and their gifts.
- > A new model – strong example of community-style programs for persons with disabilities.



Context and Challenges

- > Violence – the war going on in the Eastern part of Ukraine impacts the rest of the country.
- > Limited resources – Without State subsidies, the community is able to raise 1/3 of the total operating budget. It is dependent on foreign aid for the rest.
- > Big distances – it takes up to 1.5 hours to get from the community house to some of the workshops; gathering the community is costly.
